

Aldermaston Petroleum Storage Depot (PSD)

Please read this card carefully and keep it in a safe place where you can easily refer to it. Make sure everyone at this property knows and understands these instructions.

If a major accident happens at the Aldermaston PSD, you will be alerted by the site COMAH siren/alarm.

You will be notified of the all clear by a further siren once any danger has passed.

Test

The sirens are tested on the third day of each month at 3pm. The test is a 15 second alert warning, 10 second silence and 5 second all clear signal. You do not need to take any action during test alarm signals.

This card is produced in accordance with the Control of Major Accident Hazards (COMAH) Regulations to advise you what to do in the unlikely event of a major accident on our premises that could affect you and people near you.

EMERGENCY INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR SAFETY

GO IN, TUNE IN, STAY IN

GO IN

- On hearing the siren, everyone must go inside immediately.
- Shut all outside doors and windows.
- Pull curtains/blinds across windows facing the Aldermaston PSD site.
- Turn off any ventilation, heating or air conditioning system that draws in air from the outside.
- Stay in a room that does not face the Aldermaston PSD site.
- Please do not try to leave the area unless told to evacuate.

TUNE IN

Tune in to the local radio and TV stations which will broadcast further information.

STAY IN

- Remain indoors until you receive instructions.
- If children are at school do not attempt to collect them they will be looked after until it is safe to go outside.

- An 'all clear' will be given when it is safe to go outside.
