This privacy notice sets out how the Council uses your data in relation to the Wellbeing Walks scheme that it runs in affiliation with The Ramblers UK. Any queries about how The Ramblers UK control and process your data should be directed to dataprotection@ramblers.zendesk.com

The Council is a Wellbeing Walks partner for The Ramblers UK and runs a local scheme of short walks that are led by local volunteers.

These walks are free and open to anyone over the age of 18.

Upon attending your first Wellbeing Walk, a walker will be requested to fill out a registration form for:

- Insurances purposes;
- To provide consent for the collection of data

The Council will process the following personal data about you:

- First and surname;
- Email address; and
- Postal address and postcode.

This data will be shared with The Ramblers UK and uploaded onto their website.

Where permission is given data will be stored on the Council's system in order for walkers to receive email communications and updates about the local West Berkshire Wellbeing walks scheme and monitor the success of the programme. Your data will be protected using up to date technical and organisational security measures.

SOURCE OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

We collect the above information about you from the data you enter when you register with The West Berkshire Wellbeing Walks Scheme

PURPOSE AND LEGAL BASIS FOR PROCESSING YOUR PERSONAL DATA

SHARING YOUR PERSONAL DATA

Your data will be seen by: -

- the Wellbeing Walks coordinator at the Council; and

Where a service or information request requires us to share your data with other parties, a separate privacy notice will describe who that is.

We may share your personal data with third parties where it is necessary for the delivery of the service.

We may also share your data if we are required to do so by law, for example by court order or to prevent fraud or other crime.

RETAINING YOUR PERSONAL DATA

Your personal data will not be kept longer than necessary.

You can check how long the Council will keep each type of data against our retention schedule (www.westberks.gov.uk/retention).

YOUR RIGHTS

Under certain circumstances, by law you have the right to:

- **Request access** to your personal information (commonly known as a "data subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal information we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- **Request correction** of the personal information that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about you corrected.
- **Request erasure** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal information where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal information where you have exercised your right to object to processing (see below).
- **Object to processing** of your personal information where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You also have the right to object where we are processing your personal information for direct marketing purposes.
- **Request the restriction of processing** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of personal information about you, for example if you want us to establish its accuracy or the reason for processing it.
- **Request the transfer** of your personal information to another party.
- Withdraw consent to the processing of your personal data at any time, where processing is based on your consent. To withdraw your consent, please contact our Data Protection Officer using the contact details below. Once we have received notification that you have withdrawn your consent, we will no longer process your information for the purpose or purposes you originally agreed to, unless we have another legitimate basis for doing so in law.

HOW TO MAKE A REQUEST

If you wish to make a request associated with any of the rights listed above, contact the Council using the contact details at the top of this notice.

INTERNATIONAL TRANSFERS

Your personal data will not be processed outside the UK or by an international organisation.

COMPLAINTS

If you consider that your personal data has been misused or mishandled, you may make a complaint to the Information Commissioner, who is an independent regulator. Further
