(20 MPH SPEED LIMIT AND PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2003

WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL in exercise of powers contained in sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2), 84(1) and (2) to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following order:-

1. This order shall come into operation on the 31st day of January 2003 and may be cited as the WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL (STONEY LANE, STATION ROAD, VICTOR ROAD, HARTMEAD ROAD, COOMBE COURT, KENNET CLOSE, THE HOLLANDS AND ADWOOD COURT, THATCHAM) (20 MPH SPEED LIMIT AND PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2003

2(1) In this order -

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an order made or having effect as if made under the Act;

"disabled person" has the same meaning as in Section 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England)Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority 125 millimetres square, coloured orange if issued before 1 April 2000 or 125 millimetres square and coloured blue if issued on or after that date and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting begins:

- (2) For the purpose of this order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if -
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or

- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so the Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position if -
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard of facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
- (3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this order to a numbered article or schedule is a reference to the article or schedule bearing that number in this order.

PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING

- Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 am and 5.00 pm on Monday to Friday inclusive in the lengths of road or sides of roads specified in Schedule 1
- 4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road or sides of road referred to therein for as long as it may be necessary to enable
 - a a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - b the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in conjunction with any of the following operations. namely
 - i building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - ii the removal of any obstruction to traffic
 - the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or sides of road; or
 - the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of road or sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity of any telecommunication system as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

- the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- d the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
- e the vehicle to wait at or near any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road or sides of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
- f the vehicle to be used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- g the vehicle to wait for as long as it may be necessary to enable it to be used in the provision of a local service within the meaning of the Transport Act 1985.
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the said lengths of roads or sides of road for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle
- (3) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait upon an authorised parking place; or
- (4) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any lengths of road or sides of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being separated by a interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of road on the same day)
- No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 mph on any part of the roads specified in Schedule 2

From a point 60 metres south east of its junction with the eastern kerbline of Stoney Lane to its junction with The Moors
